Our bill was not let out of Committee today and has died in the House. However, given its importance to DU, the City, and our Community, I am not willing to let it die so quickly and am taking measures to bring it up in the Senate.

Assuming we were to prevail in the Senate, House, and Governor's desk, this is just the General Bill. The Local Legislation bill would still have to have 100% support of the Dalton Whitfield Delegation which it currently does not have as Rep Jason Ridley is still opposed to the bill as "it takes away the right of the people to vote." To which I counter, these bills simply put the City of Dalton on parity with the MEAG cities.
