Subject: Road Closures for November 3rd and 4th



The General Services Administration has informed the Facilities Management and Services Division that several potential road closures are planned for Tuesday, November 3 and Wednesday, November 4 in the downtown DC area due to planned protests. The following streets will be intermittently restricted to vehicular traffic from approximately 12:00 am on Tuesday, November 3 through 11:59 pm on Wednesday, November 4. The decision to restrict vehicles will be based upon public safety.

- Constitution Avenue, NW from 9th Street, NW to 18th Street, NW
- Pennsylvania Avenue, NW from 9th Street, NW to 18th Street, NW
- Connecticut Avenue, NW from H Street, NW to L Street, NW
- Vermont Avenue from H Street, NW to L Street, NW
- F Street from 18th Street, NW to 9th Street, NW
- G Street from 18th Street, NW to 9th Street, NW
- I Street from 18th Street, NW to 9th Street, NW
- H Street from 18th Street, NW to 9th Street, NW
- K Street from 18th Street, NW to 9th Street, NW
- New York Avenue, NW from 18th Street, NW to 9th Street, NW
- 16th Street From H Street, NW to L Street, NW
- 15th Street from Constitution Avenue, NW to L Street, NW (to include both sides of McPherson Square)
- 14th Street from Constitution Avenue, NW to L Street, NW
- 13th Street from Pennsylvania Avenue, NW to L Street, NW
- 12th Street from Constitution Avenue, NW to L Street, NW
- 11th Street from Constitution Avenue, NW to L Street, NW
- 10th Street from Constitution Avenue, NW to L Street, NW

All street closures and listed times are subject to change based upon prevailing or unexpected conditions.

A number of streets in the vicinity will also be posted as "Emergency No Parking" during this time. All vehicles that are parked in violation of the emergency no parking signs will be ticketed and towed. At this time, the Ronald Reagan Building garage plans to be open.
